

Research to identify the contribution to Health Outcomes by Regional Housing Policy

Client: West Midlands Regional Housing Executive, WM DoH In collaboration with GLHS

INTRODUCTION

This project identified the contribution that could be made to health outcomes by regional housing policy. It included a review of emerging national and regional health plans and policies; a comprehensive review of the literature; and an analysis of housing-related interventions to improve health.

A key output was the identification of regional housing policy areas that could be developed to support the delivery of better health outcomes in the West Midlands region.



BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

This project, completed in May 2010 by Housing Vision with GLHS was to identify the contribution that could be made to health outcomes by regional housing policy.

The brief was to:

- present an understanding of the main housing and health issues;
- provide evidence of the positive impact housing can have on health and vice versa;
- identify the factors that will influence the effectiveness of a response; and
- present available housing policy options.

PROJECT APPROACH

The main features were:

- A review of existing and emerging health plans and policies at national and regional level, and consultation with a small sample of key health stakeholders in the West Midlands region, to establish vision and direction.
- A review of evidence from Joint Strategic Needs Assessments (JSNAs), Strategic Housing Market Assessments (SHMAs) and research from Urban Living, the Birmingham and Sandwell Housing Market Renewal Pathfinder.

 A review of literature on the housing-health interrelationship, an evaluation of the relevance and potential of a range of data on housing, neighbourhoods, and demographics; and evidence of European, national and regional housing-related interventions to improve health. These detailed analyses informed the policy options arising from the research.

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The key output of the work was the identification of regional housing policy areas that could be developed to support the delivery of better health outcomes.

For example, how could more be made of housing in preventing ill-health and promoting health?

Could policy and action be targeted to achieve a combination of health, well-being and economic objectives?

And could a common perspective be developed on the housing-health relationship to inform the development of integrated housing and health policies?

The aim of these and other policy questions was to encourage the embedding of health impacts in housing policy, for example by 'designing in health' to new or re-modelled housing environments.

All Housing Vision output has to pass our simple "So what" test – "So what does this mean for the client or householder?" and "So what practical applications can this information be used for?".

This test means that everybody is able to understand how the research and analysis has been conducted **and** the final results; how conclusions have been reached **and** how they can best be applied.
